



Assessment of Cost Trends and Price Differences for U.S. Hospitals Refutes Unsupported Claims of Market Power


Key Findings

- Hospital prices are directly related to the cost of care.
- Over the last decade, increased expenditures on labor explain a substantial proportion of overall costs to hospitals.
- Up to 72% of the differences in hospital prices for non-Medicare services can be explained by how sick patients are and costs of care.
- There is no data to show that remaining differences is due to market power.
